

<b>The Passover</b>	Gods deliverance of the Jews from under the bondage of Egypt.
Pilgrimage	Passover is one of the three "pilgrimage" festivals in Scripture, during which the Jews were commanded to travel to Jerusalem and observe the feasts together.
Comparison	Many comparisons in this celebration between PASSOVER and EASTER
Jewish (7 days)	A Jewish festival celebrates the exodus from Egypt and the Israelites' freedom from slavery, bondage Jesus and his disciples were Jews and they celebrated the Passover.
Christian	(Easter)Christian celebrate the sinless life, death, resurrection of Jesus, release from sin bondage
Celebrate Forever	Exodus 12:14 'Now this day will be a memorial to you, and you shall celebrate it [as] a feast to the LORD; throughout your generations you are to celebrate it [as] a permanent ordinance.
<b>Background</b>	Genesis 41:56 When the famine was [spread] over all the face of the earth.... 7 years
Joseph	Genesis 37:18-36 Jacob's son Joseph sold into slavery by his brothers Patriarchs = (Abraham-Isaac-Jacob)
Slavery	Genesis 37:36 Meanwhile, the Midianites sold him in Egypt to Potiphar, Pharaoh's officer...
God gave a dream	Genesis 41:16 Joseph then answered Pharaoh, saying, "It is not in me; God will give Pharaoh a favorable answer."
Leadership	Genesis 41:41 And Pharaoh said to Joseph, "See I have set you over all the land of Egypt."
Jacob Moves	(God) Genesis 46:4 "I will go down with you to Egypt, and I will also surely bring you up again; (approx. 70)
Egypt - cruel	Exodus 1:11 So they appointed taskmasters over them to afflict them with hard labor. Exodus 1:22 Then Pharaoh commanded all his people, saying, "Every son who is born you are to cast into the Nile, and every daughter you are to keep alive."
Israel Prospers	Exodus 1:12 But the more they afflicted them, the more they multiplied and the more they spread out...
God is aware	Exodus 3:7 And the LORD said, "I have surely seen the affliction of My people who are in Egypt..."
Moses selected Why?	Exodus 3:10 Therefore, come now, and I will send you to Pharaoh, so that you may bring My people, the sons of Israel, out of Egypt
Jews=Promise of Redemption	Exodus 6:6 I am the LORD, and I will bring you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians, and I will deliver you from their bondage. I will also redeem you with an outstretched arm and with great judgments.
Promise of a Redeemer	Isaiah 9:6 For a child will be born to us, a son will be given to us; And the government will rest on His shoulders; And His name will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Eternal Father, Prince of Peace.
Request to leave to Pharaoh	Exodus 8:1 Then the LORD said to Moses, "Go to Pharaoh and say to him, 'Thus says the LORD, "Let My people go, that they may <u>serve</u> Me. (Our purpose - to serve him!)"
Service	Once we are born again, we stop serving the enemy and start serving Jesus!
Don't listen	Exodus 7:5 "And the Egyptians shall know that I am the LORD, when I stretch out My hand on Egypt and

Whack!	bring out the sons of Israel from their midst."
Ten Plagues to Egypt	Waters turned into Blood, frogs, gnats (Lice), swarms of insects, livestock died, boils, hail. Locust, darkness, 10 = death of firstborn
Tribulation	Compare - Fish and ocean destroyed, boils, Sea turns to blood, hailstones, insects, darkness, Scorpions
Don't go empty handed	Exodus 11:2 "Speak now in the hearing of the people that each man ask from his neighbor and each woman from her neighbor for articles of silver and articles of gold." (Used in constructing Tabernacle)
<b>Celebration Meals with many festivals</b>	
Seder (order)	A Jewish ritual service and ceremonial dinner for the first night or first two nights of Passover.
Last Supper	Jesus and his disciples celebrated the Passover
	The night of the first Passover was the night of the tenth plague:
Leaven = Sin	Exodus 12:19 'Seven days there shall be no leaven found in your houses; for whoever eats what is leavened, that person shall be cut off from the congregation of Israel, whether [he is] an alien or a native of the land.
The Order of Passover	10th of month, pick a one year old male, unblemished lamb of goat. 14th Sacrifice a unblemished Male Lamb. Who was the unblemished Lamb? (Jesus) Kill the male Lamb at twilight light. (Christ dies at 3PM)
The Blood! Baptism?	Mark their doorposts and lintels with its blood The sprinkling of the blood upon the door-posts was a symbol of open confession of our allegiance and love.
Seder Meal	Eat the flesh, roasted, with unleavened bread (without yeast/sin) and bitter herbs
Heathen Worship	It was expressly forbidden that it should be boiled, or that a bone of it should be broken.
Symbolic	Jesus - not a bone broken
To do thy will	Exodus 12:11 'Now you shall eat it in this manner: [with] your loins girded, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and you shall eat it in haste--it is the LORD'S Passover.  Prepared for journey - we do so with readiness and desire to serve to enter the active service of Christ, and to go on the journey toward heaven.  Exodus 12:13 'And the blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you live; and when I see the blood I will pass over you, and no plague will befall you to destroy [you] when I strike the land of Egypt.  Passing over the doom of sin by Christ's blood
In Christ we Live	The Passover was useless unless eaten; so we live upon the Lord Jesus Christ.  Eaten with bitter herbs - bitter herbs of repentance and confession

	Exodus 12:29 Now it came about at midnight that the LORD struck all the first-born in the land of Egypt, from the first-born of Pharaoh...to the first-born of the captive who was in the dungeon, and all the first-born of cattle.
	Exodus 12:30 ...and there was a great cry in Egypt, for there was no home where there was not someone dead.
	Exodus 12:31 (Pharaoh said) "Rise up, get out from among my people, both you and the sons of Israel; and go
	Numbers 33:3...on the next day after the Passover the sons of Israel started out boldly in the sight of all the Egyptians, <b>Mixed multitude - 600,000 men</b>
	Exodus 12:40 Now the time that the sons of Israel lived in Egypt was four hundred and thirty years
	1st Corinthians 10:5 But with many of them God was not well pleased: for they were overthrown in the wilderness.
<b>Disobedience</b>	Numbers 26:65 ...And there was not left a man of them, save Caleb the son of Jephunneh, and Joshua the son of Nun.
	<b>Disobedience ended Israel goal to destination to the promise land.</b>
